Remember that these monologues are essentially historical fiction, based on the Scripture but filling in plausible subjective details, both emotional responses and motivations. Your first task is to decide if they are reasonable.

How does the fictionalized Nehemiah respond to "media attention"?

What lessons can we take from his real life and work?

Have you been called on to carry out a task for which you had no training or experience?

What are the temptations that follow success?

What evidence was there that Nehemiah was open to the Holy Spirit in his daily life?

How did he deal with delicate situations like inter-marriage with pagans?

What made that hard? What was probably the chief temptation for Nehemiah?

Have you ever been criticized for what you felt was the right thing to do?
